OBHC is impressed with his work as well and very grateful to have this storage facility which replaces a 4' crawl space under the cabin with very limited access.







Operation Black Hills Cabin offers a week long respite in the Black Hills to qualified combat injured veterans of the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. This enables the families an opportunity to unwind, relax and reconnect as a family. They experience smiles, laughter, and compassion, reminiscent of their previous life. The families take these good feelings home with them to resume everyday life, hopefully with a feeling of interconnection as a family. They are rejuvenated and stronger to go on with the challenges they face.
